JOANA D'ARC (1412-1431)

"All battles are first won or lost, in the mind." She was only 17 when she convinced a small group of soldiers to follow her into the 100-year war (1337-1453) and save France from the English.





"Certainly God created women for a better purpose than to work in vain all their lives." The first woman to publish texts in newspapers, she also wrote books in defense of women's rights, of Indians and slaves, among them is "Women's Rights and Men's Injustices"



MARIE CURIE (1867-1934))

"Be less curious about people and more curious about ideas."

She was the first woman to win a Nobel Prize and the first person to win two Nobel Prizes in different areas (chemistry and physics).
